


These changes still mean you have close links to your local RNLI communities and work as part of the lifesaving effect within the lifeboat station if you are near to one. See below information on the day to day support available to you to achieve our vision to save everyone.







Whichever region you come under Ireland, Scotland, Wales, North and East, South East or South West there is a big team behind you to enhance your volunteering experience.







Water Safety Lifesaving Plans (WSLPs)

What are Water Safety Lifesaving Plans?

Water Safety Lifesaving Plans (WSLPs formally CLPs) are the key mechanism for the RNLI to plan and deliver community safety education and prevention at a local level.

Each plan profiles local risk, existing RNLI activity and the community we are seeking to help. This means that the community has an evidence based plan to work from in order to minimise risk in a local area. The plans should also outline the preventative activities and interventions that the RNLI intends to deliver, as well as those we will run in partnership with other local organisations.

Each plan is owned and looked after by the local community (currently identified as lifeboat stations) and is managed by the Water Safety Officer (WSO).

As of March 2022, a new iteration of WSLP(Formally CLP) development is now in operation. This new format has been developed on the coast by both Water Safety Volunteers and stations and has been piloted at a number of stations around the UK & ROI.

What about Lifesaving Managers Plans (LMPs) and Area Lifesaving Plans (ALPs)?

Each plan profiles local risk, existing RNLI activity and the demographic we are seeking to help. This is an evidence based plan to minimise risk in a local area. The plans should also outline the preventative activities and interventions that the RNLI intends to deliver, as well as those we will run in partnership with other local organisations.







Preventative Actions

There are a number of different ways that you can communicate key safety messages through face to face engagements and the use of lifesaving products to your local communities.

Individual F2F advice at a School or Youth Group

Face to face advice given to under 18's within an education environment or youth group.

Gazebo Event. Individual F2F advice at a local event

Face to face advice given at a local event - e.g. presence at marinas, boat jumbles, beach etc.

Showcase event. Individual F2F advice at an regional event

Face-to-face specific advice at an event that is larger than one community but not expected to attract national attendance, such as a County show.

Multi Departmental Event. Individual F2F advice at a national/large event

Face to face advice given at a large event such as a national show, London boat show, Great Northern dive show. More than one branch of the RNLI in attendance

Partnerships and third party advice

Training and equipping partners at local shops, activity clubs, beaches, car parks and other sites to share key safety messages and distribute resources on our behalf.

Public rescue equipment (PRE)

This could include anything from organising throw lines or a lifebuoy at a local site, to installing railings, planting gorse bushes or opening up safer paths on a cliff edge.

Interactive or information display

Installing safety information, such as signage about beach flags or with live tide information, in strategic locations.

Operational support (lifeguards and lifeboats)

Lifeguard patrols in high-risk areas or lifeboat exercises at hot spot locations.

Activity reporting

Why is it important to report?

The RNLI aims to **save every one**. Development and delivery of prevention activities are a key part of the RISE (Rescue, Influence, Supervise and Educate) model for reducing fatalities which means we need to know what we are delivering and where in terms of prevention so we can evaluate it to understand

its impact, just remember to let us know how you are helping your community by using the barcode to report your activity after every intervention!



What does reporting tell us?

By reporting regularly on your activity, this:

- Tells the rest of the organisation what Water Safety are doing, raises the profile of our team and enables you as Water Safety volunteers to get the recognition you deserve.
- Helps us to understand what impact we are having, and what more we need to do
 to successfully meet the organisational goal to save everyone
- Gives us the data to analyse and understand which interventions are working and which need to be reviewed.
- Allows the RNLI to justify more resource and support into the Water Safety team.

It is important that you report on your activity.

Step by step gide to using the Activity Reporting Microsoft Forms

- •To access either the Pro Forma or Evaluation please click on the associated hyperlink (May require you to hold left CTRL and click)
- •On the Microsoft Forms webpage, you may find it quicker to bookmark/favourite the webpage for easier access in the future. This varies by browser but is usually at the far right hand side of your web address search bar.
- Please fill out the required form (Education activity form or Pro Forma is for planning upcoming events, Evaluation is after the event has been completed) Both forms are required for each intervention that occurs. Please try and give 10 working days between submitting a Pro Forma and attending an Intervention.
- •Please ensure any activity you wish to carry out is relevant and targeted based on your local Water Safety Lifesaving Plan (WSLP), the activity should also correspond to the 'Planned Interventions' section within the WSLP(formerly CLP's Community Lifesaving Plan).
- •Once the forms has been completed, filling as much information as possible, click submit to submit the form (email Water safety@rnli.org.uk for Education forms).
- •At this point the form has been submitted, Pro Formas will go for approval to your Regional Water Safety Team. This will be completed as soon as they are capable. You will also be the oppurtunity to now save your results as a PDF.
- •To do this, click on the box 'Print or get PDF of answers'. This will open your printing window with destination set as 'Save as PDF'. Upon clicking 'Save' you will then be able to choose the save location of the submitted form. We reccommend to save all your submitted forms for your own records.
- Finally, ensure that each intervention has a Pro Forma completed beforehand, and a corresponding Evaluation is completed once the Intervention has taken place.

One of the most important tools available to support all this prevention work is the key message booklets.

The water safety key message booklet is designed to give all volunteers and staff the key information they need to speak confidently to members of the public about safety around our coastline. It includes profiles, key messages and links to find out more.

The booklet is aimed at helping those who do not already have expert knowledge about every coastal activity to deliver consistent and credible safety advice to the general public backed up with the confidence of fully referenced research. The booklet itself is not for distribution to the general public but the information inside should be used to speak confidently about safety around our coasts.

The Youth Message Booklet is designed to share water safety messaging with a younger audience, and is spilt into the different key stage categories for learning and engagement.

MyStore

We're now all ready to go, so please read the following instructions as a reminder to help you prepare.

Access to MU

MU is now closed, from this point forward you can no longer access MU. Please do not log into your marketing unity account, any orders placed will not be processed.

Logging in to MyStore

Previous MU users should have been sent an email from *noreply@linney.com*, with the subject heading "Welcome to RNLI's MyStore".

This email will have a link to the system for you to create your own password. Your User ID will be your email address, to which you received the email.

The automated password link will expire after 24 hours, therefore, if you're unable to log in to MyStore within the first 24 hours of its launch, you will be able to reset your password easily following the same link and the instructions on the website. This is an additional measure to keep MyStore secure.

Boating Products & Programmes:

Boating Activity

In May 2024 we refreshed safety messaging and resources to help boat users be prepared and know what to do if something goes wrong.

The sea looks ready are you?



Stay afloat, stay in touch, stay put

The resources bring together our key safety advice about being prepared before going afloat: wearing a lifejacket or buoyancy aid, carrying a way to call for help, and using an anchor to secure your position.

The messages are simple, clear and memorable. We've developed a range of resources to help share them, from digital resources on our website and social media channels, to physical resources for the public including key rings and leaflets.

The new boating safety interventions are now targeted to people who are new to boating (Tier 1 – The Sea Looks Ready Are You) and to those who have more experience (Tier 2 – Reduce The Risk Boost Your Skills)— making the advice more relevant to people with different levels of knowledge.







Reduce The Risk Boost Your Skills

Tier 2 Boating resources and training has been developed in conjunction with the Coastguard, Irish Sailing and the RYA to enable RNLI Water Safety Volunteers to

'save Lives'. Tier 2 is in place to prompt regular Leisure Boat users to increase their awareness of things that should be considered prior to going on the water and to prompt understanding of decisive practical action is needed in an emergency. The intervention is not designed to directly advise on parts of a boat/equipment or to train a member of the public in an action that they should take in an emergency It's also important that we continue to look at our activities and how we can keep volunteers like you safe while performing your role. These checklists will further support Trained Tier 2 water safety volunteers to deliver vital safety advice without boarding someone's boat, and all the risks associated with boarding an unfamiliar vessel.

New checklists are to be provided for boaters with a list of things to consider before going afloat, including the weather forecast and tide times, onboard safety equipment, crew emergency action planning and making sure the crew are wearing appropriate clothing for the conditions.

Sand signage

Sand signage is a light touch volunteering role where safety messaging is engraved into the sand so members of the public can read water safety messaging, also share pictures on social media to reach a wider audience.



When?

These signs are used to highlight local hazards and conditions so when you will be asked to do this can be variable. You will be linked with a local member of the RNLI Lifesaving team to identify times and patterns when this signage will be effective.

Where?

This will be in your local area and works best on sandy beaches with a high elevation that the public can view the messaging from. Sand Signage is proven to be a highly effective way of providing timely localised messaging.

Why?

We are looking for support from within the local communities to deliver this; together we truly believe we can save lives. Over half the people that get into trouble in the water didn't expect to get wet. We need support from local people to deliver this timely, adaptable messaging. 


